- Our preferred hack: Go online and enter to win! Broadway shows have a lottery everyday. TodayTix has some (https://www.todaytix.com/) though we find the widest selection is on Broadway For Broke People (https://broadwayforbrokepeople.com/). For both, note that there is a window for notification, and you'll need to act swiftly to pay for your ticket to claim it—read the fine print when entering.







Whitney Museum of Art

From the hotel, head south towards 42nd St to head to Brooklyn. Once in 42nd Subway Station, you need to find the 2 or 3 subway lines (red) going Downtown. Get off at Borough Hall Station and walk 4 minutes to Schermerhorn St.

Transit Museum of NYC

New York Transit Museum is dedicated to telling and preserving the stories of mass transportation: extraordinary engineering feats, workers who labored in the tunnels over 100 years ago, communities that were drastically transformed, and the ever-evolving technology, design, and ridership of a system that runs 24 hours a day, every day of the year.
